Freedom of Information Request Reference N°: FOI 000538/17

I write in connection with your request for information received by the Norfolk Constabulary on the 17th January 2017 in which you sought access to the following information:

Last year my colleague asked for information concerning recent noise pollution and anti social behaviour on that area for the period leading up to July 2015. I have a copy of your response with the reference FOI 000488/16

I would now like to request that this information (ie the number and nature of the complaints made re. the play equipment and the result of your investigations) could be brought up to date -ie up to mid-January 2017.

Equally, if you have the information, I would like to know the number of individuals who have complained (obviously their names are confidential) and as to whether these were residents of Orchard Way, or other (maybe anonymous) individuals.

Norfolk Constabulary holds information relevant to your request.

Response to your Request

Norfolk Constabulary has located the following information as relevant to your request.

Incidents of ASB, up to August 2016, have been released via a previous Freedom of Information request. A copy of this is published on the Norfolk Constabulary Disclosure Log.

Under Section 21(1) of the Freedom of Information Act (2000), public authorities are not required to provide information that is reasonably accessible to the public by other means, in this case via the Norfolk Constabulary website; therefore in accordance with Section 17 of the Freedom of Information Act (2000), this serves as a Refusal Notice for this part of your request.

A report was received of people shouting and screaming on the playground at Kings Head Meadow. This has been going on for 10 minutes.

PLEASE NOTE

We have not included incidents which relate to the football club or the car park area near the library.

Of the 8 reports, detailed on this and the previous response, 5 were received from callers in Orchard Way.
